What is Fall?

Fall is nature's New Year:

There's more you can do in Fall, and not just at 11:09 tonight! My five-element acupuncturist friend Tamme Marggraf* advises that the "gift *and* challenge" of Fall is "letting go." Letting go may not sound like much of a New Year's party. It can feel scary, like the death we see around us during this season. But if we don't let go of what doesn't serve us anymore, where are we going to put the new stuff that does serve us when we receive it? Fall is for *trusting in future abundance*, and making space and time for it in our lives. This is why I advise you to **plan your work and work your plan *now*** so you can "store up time" for Winter's generosity and warm relationship-building (see the "Income Idea of the Season" in this issue, below).

We're just coming out of the late Summer-early Fall harvest season, the final season in nature's cycle. Harvest is vital: *hoarding* is a pain. Letting go *is* the gift of the New Year. The first gift. The one that opens us to all the gifts that follow. ✨

Income Idea of the Season:

Plan Now to Have *Time* to Build Relationships in Winter

The word for Fall is IMPLEMENTATION. Summer stinks for fundraising (mostly). So you've used summer to plan for your fundraising year right? And now it's time to work your plan.

What? No plan? Sketchy, incomplete plan? You still have time.

Elements of your plan: 1. Know your expenses. (Note that this is *not* your "budget." Your budget has two sides: expenses and income.) 2. Know what's missing. 3. Know what's been committed or raised. 4. Plan how to raise

what's missing. **5. Plan the *time* to work the plan to raise what's missing.**

We are one season ahead of the most generous time of the year (that's Winter, for all of us who are sequentially challenged). Plan to benefit from seasonal rhythm: **do what you need to do now to have time available starting in mid-November to ask the people who love your work the most for a gift that meets their interests—as personally as possible.**

I dare you to make enough time to have a conversation or even a meal with those who love you, and find out what matters to them, including but not limited to what you do. You will never regret the relationships you build in this way. See how many people you can do this with. **Hint: do what you need to do now so you can more of this starting in mid-November.**

If your income is not donation-based but fee-based, or investment-based, this is still the time to plan to cultivate relationships in Winter you have let languish with those who care about your work and promote it.
